

Introduction of a New Series of Bank of Japan Notes

Issuance Date

- In June 2023, the Bank of Japan announced that it would start issuing the new series of Bank of Japan notes in around the first half of July 2024.
- After giving due consideration to such factors as the busy schedules of financial institutions, the date has now been set for <u>July 3, 2024</u>.

2. Preparations at the Bank of Japan

- The Bank has been steadily stockpiling the new series of Bank of Japan notes since 2022, when the National Printing Bureau started mass production.
- The total stockpiled is expected to reach 4.53 billion notes at the end of fiscal 2023 and will be further accumulated until the issuance date of the new series. The stockpile is expected to be broadly similar in volume to that accumulated when the current series was first issued (about 5 billion notes).

3. Adaptations to Cash Handling Equipment

- Financial institutions, which play a major role in cash circulation, have been adapting their machines to the new series of Bank of Japan notes as planned these adaptations are expected to be mostly completed by the end of June 2024.
- An association of the cash handling equipment industry explained that "adaptations to such equipment as self-checkout registers and ticket vending machines have progressed as planned, although some automatic vending machines have yet to receive updates because of the large number of such machines and the spread of cashless payments."

(Ref. 1) Background to the Introduction of the New Series

- The demand for cash, which can be readily used by anyone, anywhere, and at any time, remains strong despite the cashless trend; it will likely continue to play a significant role as a means of payment.
- Considering such factors as the time passed since when the current series of Bank of Japan notes was first issued and advances in printing technology, the Bank deems it necessary to continue in its endeavors to prevent the counterfeiting of Bank of Japan notes.






These security features are also incorporated in 5,000 yen and 1,000 yen notes.






Raised print feels rough to the touch.

5,000 yen: 2 bars




1,000 yen: 1 bar

The 3-D portraits rotate when tilted. Other hologram patterns also change depending on the viewing angle.

Using a magnifying glass reveals micro letters that cannot be reproduced by copy machines.










8 Luminescent ink


Pearl ink



A pink, pearly pattern appears in the blank areas of the left and right margins when tilted.


(2) Universal Design -- Improved Identifiability --

- ✓ Check with your eyes
 - ① Shape and position of holograms and watermarks



To help identify the denomination, the holograms and watermarks are different shapes and in different positions, depending on the denomination.

2 Enlarged numerals indicating face value




To enable easier identification of the denomination, the new notes have enlarged Arabic numerals indicating the face value on the front and back of the notes.

✓ Check with your fingers

3 Tactile marks

Tactile marks help to identify the denomination by touch. To further help identification, the new notes have marks comprising 11 diagonal lines in different positions, depending on the denomination.
